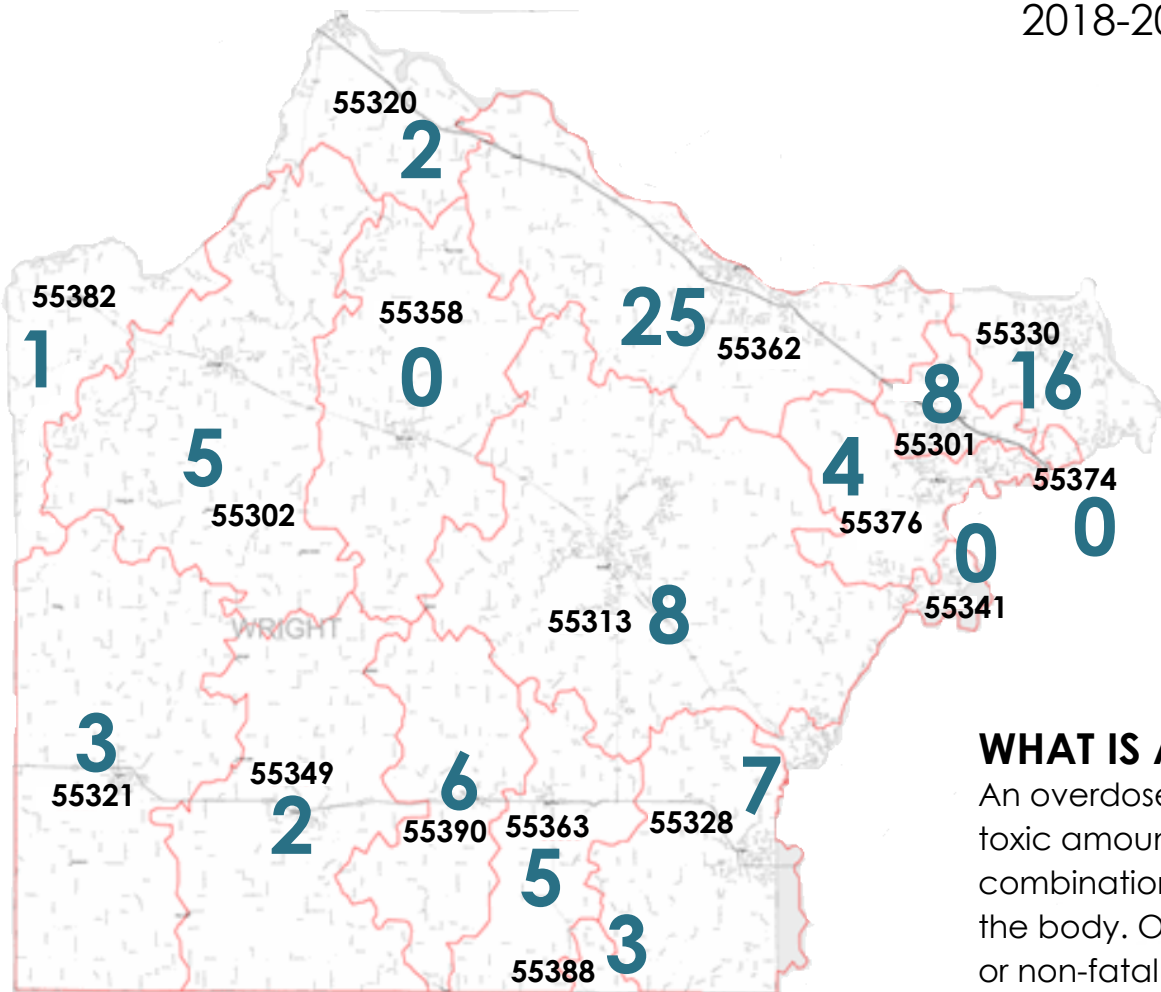

WHAT IS AN OVERDOSE?

An overdose happens when a toxic amount of a drug or combination of drugs overwhelms the body. Overdoses can be fatal or non-fatal.

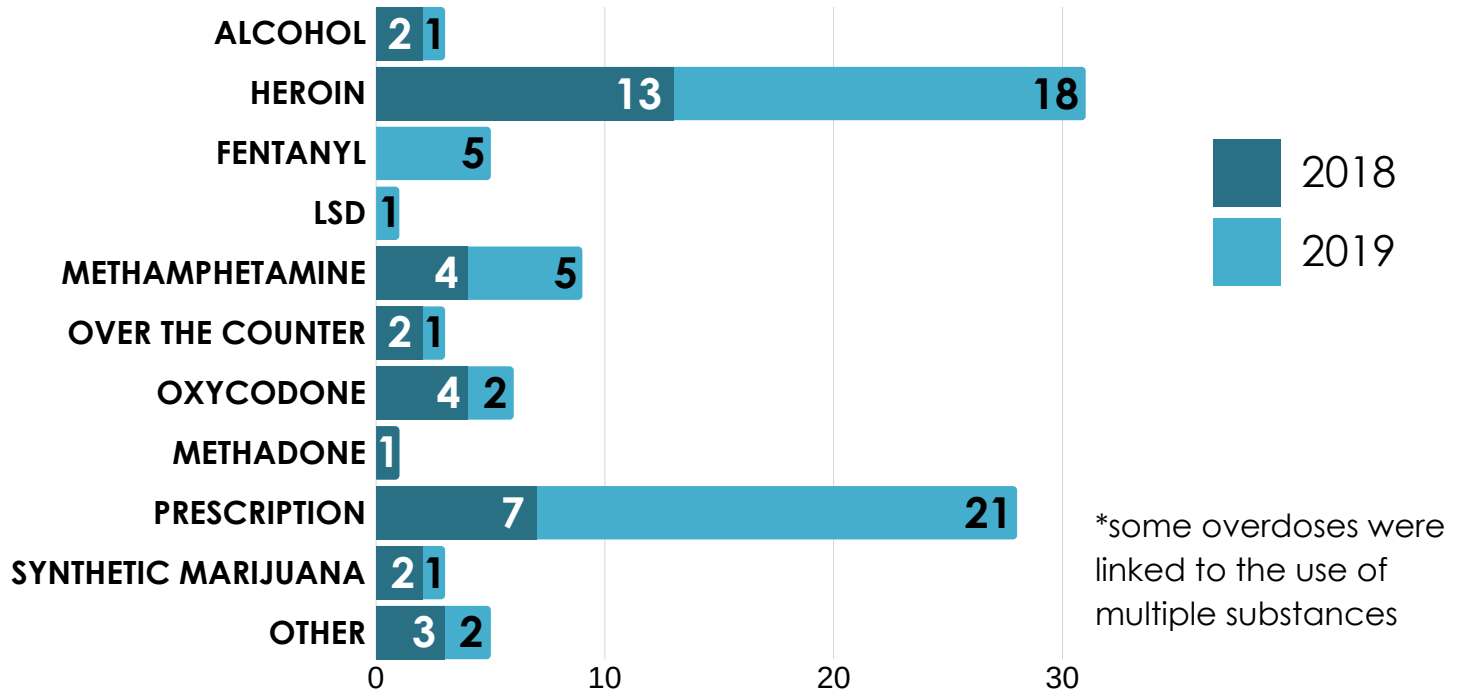
TRACKING OVERDOSES

The Overdose Detection Mapping Application (OD Map) allows for easy tracking of overdose trends and events in our county, throughout the state, and across the nation. Currently, the Wright County Sheriff's Office is the only agency contributing data to the map, leaving overdoses untracked if an individual overdoses and is brought directly to the emergency department without the involvement of law enforcement or emergency medical services.

OVERDOSE SUBSTANCES

In Wright County, there were 38 suspected overdoses in 2018 and 57 in 2019 entered into the OD Map.

- Of those suspected overdoses, 15 were fatal
- Of the 15 fatal, the most common suspected substances were
 - Fentanyl (2019)
 - Heroin (2018 & 2019)
 - Methamphetamine (2018 & 2019)
 - Oxycodone (2018 & 2019)
- The substances involved in suspected overdoses include*:



LIFE SAVING RESOURCES

Of the 95 suspected overdoses,

28 received naloxone & 25 were saved by it.

Naloxone is a common overdose reversal agent accessible to all Wright County Law Enforcement Agencies. Naloxone has been shown effective to reverse an active opioid overdose.
